The Asian Congress 2016 on Alternatives and Animal Use in the Life Sciences was held jointly with

the 29th Annual Meeting of the Japanese Society for Alternatives to Animal Experiments at the

Karatsu Civic Hall in Karatsu, Saga, and at Kyushu University in Fukuoka, Fukuoka, from November

15 to 18, 2016. As the first conference of its kind for researchers from Asia, the Asian Congress 2016

was an excellent opportunity to promote the Three Rs and the use of alternative test methods to

researchers in this region. Attended by almost 530 professionals, including 80 non-Japanese from 17

chair of ACT, Italy, was a further indication of how Asia's standing as a leader in this field has

solidified. Other plenary lectures were given by Dr. Joanne Zurlo of the Center for Alternatives to

Animal Testing (CAAT) at Johns Hopkins University in the United States of America as well as by Dr.

Troy Seidle of the Research & Toxicology Humane Society International, Canada. There were six

sessions held at the Karatsu venue: 1. Trends in the 3Rs of Animal Experiments in Asia, 2. The 3Rs in

Testing Pesticides and Chemicals, 3. Cosmetic Regulation and Alternatives to Animal Testing, 4. The

3Rs in Biologicals and Others, 5. Future Approaches to Alternative Tests and the 3Rs, and 6, The

Young Scientist Award. The 34 invited speakers and 82 poster presentations created a splendid

atmosphere in at Kyusyu University, where each Asian country and region was represented. I wish to

express my heartfelt appreciation to all the presenters, participants, and sponsors who helped make the

Asian Congress 2016 such a tremendous success.

Looking forward, China will host the upcoming Asian Congress in 2018, and Korea will host the

next Congress after that. The JSAAE welcomes this collaboration from other countries throughout

Asia in maintaining Asia's standing in the field of the Three Rs and alternatives to animal testing.
